Getting to Rouen

Hop on a train at **Saint-Lazare train station in Paris** and you will be in Normandy in no time. When you get to Rouen, the **Rouen Rive-droite train station in the city centre** is served by several public transport services (bus, underground and TEOR bus routes), which will take you to our campuses or your accommodation.

From ROISSY - CHARLES-DE-GAULLE (CDG) Airport

Take the RER B train (towards Massy) à Châtelet metro station: take line 14 (towards Saint-Lazare) à Saint-Lazare train station

You can also take the Roissy bus from the airport to the Opéra metro station in Paris. From here, it takes about five minutes to walk to Saint-Lazare train station, where you can get a train to Rouen.

Alternatively, you can catch a direct bus from Roissy-Charles de Gaulle (CDG) Airport to Rouen.

From ORLY Airport

Take the Orly bus (towards Place Denfert-Rochereau) and get off at the Invalides bus stop.

Then take metro line 13 (towards Saint-Lazare), which will take you to Saint-Lazare train station. You can take a train to Rouen from here.

From PARIS BEAUVAIS Airport

Take the airport shuttle bus (towards Paris - it's the only shuttle bus service) and get off at the Porte-Maillot bus stop. From here, take metro line 1 (towards Château de Vincennes) and get off at the Châtelet metro station. From Châtelet, take metro line 14 (towards Saint-Lazare) until you get to Saint-Lazare train station, where you can catch a train to Rouen.

Visa and residence permits

- registering at the university,
- finding out about cultural activities, clubs and societies,
- applying for your residence permit if you are a student from outside of the European Union or European Economic Area.

Living costs - Getting your budget right

Accommodation

Halls of residence (CROUS): €250-350 per month

Private residence: €350-500 per month

Housing insurance: from €20 per year

If you decide to stay in a hall of residence, you will have a choice of **five halls** when you apply:

- *La résidence du Bois* (Mont-Saint-Aignan campus)
- *La résidence du Panorama* (Mont-Saint-Aignan campus)
- *La résidence Galois*
- *La résidence du Madrillet* (Madrillet campus)
- *La résidence Jardin Saint-Paul*

Please note that **rental rates are revised every year in January** and that **you may not be automatically allocated a room** in a hall of residence as **places are limited**.

Getting around

The Greater Rouen public transport network is managed by [Réseau Astuce](#).

Monthly Astuce travel card for the under 26: €27.50

10 journey ticket: €14.50 / 10 journey ticket for the under 26: €8.60

Single ticket: €1.70

On Saturday, traveling on Astuce transport network **is free**, but you must still have a ticket or travel card and **validate** it. No trip will be deducted from your ticket or card.

Meal at the refectory: €3,30

Scholarship recipients and low-income students: €1.

Meal at a restaurant: from €10 / Meal at a fast-food outlet: €5-10

Coffee: €2-4

Baguette: €1

Six eggs: €1.50

A sandwich+drink menu at a bakery: €5-8

A litre of milk: €1.50

Leisure activities

Cinema: €5-8 (reduced price tickets)

Museums, exhibitions: often free or between €5 and €10

A beer in a bar: from €3.50

Opening a bank account

If you are planning to stay in France for **over three months**, as a “resident”, you can open a **bank account**. Most banks will ask you to provide the following documents:

- Your passport
- Your residence permit (if required)
- Proof of residence (rental agreement, phone, electricity or gas bill, a rent receipt, etc.) featuring your name and address to prove you live in France.

Choosing a bank

Before leaving home, **check with your bank whether they are partnered with a bank in France**, as this could simplify certain operations. If you don't have any specific needs, choose one of the mainstream French banks with branches all over the country.

Accommodation

Halls of residence managed by the CROUS

The **regional student services office (CROUS)** offers over 5,600 places in fully-furnished university residences or halls at **five different locations**. This accommodation also offers **several on-site facilities**: cafeterias, laundrettes, TV rooms, parking spaces, Wi-Fi.

Pricing:

- around €240 per month for a 9 m² room, with an ensuite bathroom and shared kitchen.
- Up to €500 per month for a one-bedroom flat (T2).

Private accommodation

- Private student accommodation
- Individual or shared accommodation rented through an agency or a landlord
- A room rented from a live-in landlord
- A room in a hostel run by a faith-based organisation, in a hostel for young professionals, or in social housing accommodation

Housing benefits - *Caisse d'Allocation Familiale (CAF)*

As a resident in France, **you may be eligible to receive financial support** to pay for accommodation.

To apply for housing benefits, you have to:

- Fill in the online application on the [CAF \(family allowance office\) website](#)
- Print and send the application by mail or hand it in person to the CAF office in Rouen, along with the supporting documents (don't forget to open a bank account first!)

Insurance

Housing insurance

Housing insurance is mandatory in France. You will be asked to provide a guarantor (an EU citizen) for your accommodation. If you do not have a guarantor, you can visit www.visale.fr to obtain a guarantor.

Health insurance

If you are from a **country within the European Union**, you will need to have your **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** with you. That way, you won't have to register for French health insurance.

If you are from a **non-EU country**, you will need to **register with the CPAM** (French social security scheme), even if you are already registered with a public scheme in another country or have a private insurance scheme.

Additional insurance

As a precautionary measure, you can take out insurance with a student mutual insurance company to cover any extra health costs. For more information: www.ameli.fr, www.smeno.com, www.lmde.com.
